Thank you for taking an interest in the Good Care Collaborative (GCC). Launched in January 2014, the GCC is a coalition of providers and advocates from across the state with a mission to reform Medicaid by improving quality and outcomes while reducing costs. The GCC is a strategic effort to shift the dialogue around Medicaid reform to focus on what it is that we are buying with our Medicaid dollars, and most importantly, whether we are buying “good care”. Through site visits, webinars, and conferences the GCC is highlighting existing examples of good care within New Jersey and across the country in an effort to further seed this dialogue and build a collective vision of what constitutes “good care”.

The GCC also aims to develop and advocate short and mid-term policy reforms that gradually advance the system closer to the ultimate vision of good care. The current GCC policy goals include: successfully implementing the Medicaid ACO Demonstration Project; improving Medicaid transportation; integrating behavioral health and medical care; promoting the integration of administrative data on health and health care; developing Housing First models of supportive housing for homeless high users of the healthcare system; and shifting emphasis from telephonic nurse care management to community based care management in Medicaid. The GCC has identified these policy areas as holding the most promise of achieving meaningful progress quickly.

The GCC’s strength lies in the breadth and diversity of its participants. We are consumers, providers, advocates, policy experts, and public servants.
